Reservation Procedures:

Phone reservations are not accepted. Only a completed application with facilities fee is considered a reservation by the council. Individual per/person payments is made upon arrival.

For BSA Units:

For Community Organizations:

- ◆ Complete Reservation Application
- ◆ Attach a check mad out to: Greenwich Council, BSA
- ◆ Complete the Hold-Harmless Agreement
- ◆ Provide Certificate of Liability Insurance with a minimum of \$1,000,000 combined single limit with the Greenwich Council, BSA and the National Council, BSA named as additional insured, ten (10) days written notice of cancellation and the period of time covered

Check-In procedures: You may check in at anytime between 6 and 8 PM Friday and after 9AM Saturday

- ◆ Upon arrival in Camp, Unit leaders will be briefed buy the campmaster of camp representative. You will be asked to settle any fees that are due. Present your units approved application along with a completed unit roster and an approved Tour Permit for non-Greenwich Council BSA units.
- ◆ The Campmster will provide a map and will brief you on the camp boundaries and markings. Please refer to the back page of this brochure for the Camp Rules and Regulations. You will be asked to use only the site(s) and/or building(s) assigned to your unit. Occasionally we may have to change your site for cogent reasons.
- ◆ Your vehicle(s) will be directed to the parking area. Vehicles are not allowed in any other area of the camp
There are no exceptions to the rule!
- ◆ The campmaster will inform your of the Trading Post hours of operation. An adult must be present with Scouts making purchases. Typical items sold are: t-shirts, patches, pins, mugs, candy and snacks.

Check-Out procedures: You must check-out anytime before Sunday 12 Noon

- ◆ Notify the campmaster when your campsite is ready for inspection. Leaving Seton Scout Reservation without an authorized inspection will jeopardize future use of Seton Scout Reservation.
- ◆ All camping gear is to be brought down to the parking area on foot. Do not drive your vehicle to the campsite to remove gear and belongings. Plan to camp like a scout unit, not a family picnic. If you can't carry it leave it home. There are no trailers allowed at campsites.

Directions to Ernest Thompson Seton Reservation:

From Merritt Parkway Southbound:

Exit 27 - *King Street*: At the end of the ramp, turn right and proceed until you see St. Paul's Church on the right hand side. Turn right onto Sherwood Avenue. Continue on Sherwood Avenue to the end. Make a left onto Rivesville Road. Proceed straight a short distance to the Reservation which will be on the right and clearly marked.

From New York, New Jersey, and Areas south via the Hutchinson River Parkway Northbound

Exit 30S - *King Street*: At the end of the ramp, turn left and proceed until you see St. Paul's Church on the right hand side. Turn right onto Sherwood Avenue. Continue on Sherwood Avenue to the end. Make a left onto Rivesville Road. Proceed straight a short distance to the Reservation which will be on the right and clearly marked.

From Route 684

Exit 3 - *Route 22*: Proceed North on Route 22 for 3/10 mile to Route 433. Proceed South on Route 433 for about 4.4 miles Route 433 turns into Rivesville Road in Connecticut. Seton Reservation will be on your left, just past a large granite rock out cropping. The entrance is clearly marked.

From Connecticut Thruway (I95) North and South

Exit 3 - *Arch Street*: Northbound, turn left and the end of the ramp. Southbound, turn right ant the end of the ramp and proceed strait under the railroad overpass. Go Strait through the traffic light. take the next left onto Field Point Road. Take the next left onto Brookside Drive. At the traffic light proceed straight across US1 and continue on Brookside Drive to the end. Turn right onto Glenville Road and continue past the small town to the firehouse on the left hand side. Make a right at the traffic light onto Rivesville Road. Proceed on Rivesville Road for 2 miles to the Reservation on the right. The entrance is clearly marked.

Ernest Thompson Seton Scout Reservation Rules and Regulations

The Ernest Thompson Seton Reservation is a year-round facility of approximately 240 acres for use by BSA units and by non-scouting organizations having established leadership and fiscal responsibility. The council reserves the right to accept or reject any organization. All BSA camping will be in accordance with the BSA manual Guide to Safe Scouting. A copy is available and the following rules and regulations.

OVERNIGHT CAMPING

Cub Scouts: Supervision is to be in accordance with the BSA Manual: Guide To Safe Scouting. Bathrooms, latrines, and showers shall be separate or controlled to a single gender by using signs or by indicating specific times used within your group. Greenwich Council Tiger Cubs and Cub Scouts grades 2 and 3 are not authorized to camp overnight except for Council sponsored family camping weekends. A Webelo Scout may participate in overnight den camping when supervised by his mother or father. If a parent can't attend, arrangements must be made by the boy's family for another youth's parent (Not The Webelos Leader) or another adult to be a substitute at the campout. Out-of-Council Tiger Cubs and Cub Scouts grades 2 and 3 may not camp. Out-of-Council Webelos Scouts grades 3 and 4 may participate. The Unit roster must show school grade and indicate that all youth are Webelos. Cub Scout Packs must have a minimum of two (2) designated adult leaders IN CAMP AT ALL TIMES.

Boy Scouts: Boy Scout Troops must have a minimum of two (2) adult male and female leaders IN CAMP AT ALL TIMES. Separate facilities are required if leaders are of different genders.

Venturing Crews: Co-Ed Venturing Crews must have at least one male and female leader over the age of 21 present. Separate male/female sleeping facilities are required. Two leaders must be in camp at all times.

Pets: We Respectfully ask that you leave your pets at home. The camp is an area with resident wildlife.

Water: Water is available (weather permitting) at the latrines during Spring, Summer and Fall. There are limited water sources available from November to April. Contact the Council for more information.

Private Vehicles: Your vehicle(s) must remain in the parking area. NO VEHICLES are permitted in campsites or adjacent to the lions lodge or Activities Building. **THERE ARE NO EXCEPTIONS TO THIS RULE!**

Canoes and Rowboats: Canoes and Rowboats are available for rentals both on Seton grounds and off the camp property. Please request a boating application for further information.

Trash: The Greenwich Town Recyclable policy is in effect at Seton Scout Reservation. All recyclables must be removed. Carryout recyclable items are defined as: aluminum cans, metal cans, plastic marked with 1 or 2 within a triangle, newspapers, glass jars, bottles and conugated cardboard. All other trash must be placed in a bag and disposed of in the dumpster adjacent to the parking lot near the Utility Building. PLEASE REMEMBER TO CLOSE THE LIDS! Those violating this policy will sort garbage of pay substantial costs for this service by others.

Open Fires and Flames: Fires are permitted only in designated areas and under direct adult supervision. NO Flames or candles are permitted inside of tents. Never leave your camping area until all fires are extinguished. A leader must remain in the site until the fire is cold to the touch. **THERE ARE NO EXCEPTIONS TO THIS RULE!**

Firewood, Trees and Bushes: Use only dead wood for campfires. Do not cut living trees or drive nails or screws into them. We encourage low impact camping. Leave no trace of your visit, if possible.

Drugs, Alcohol/Tobacco and Firearms: Firearms, alcoholic beverages and controlled substances are NOT permitted on any BSA camp property. The BSA prohibits the use of alcoholic beverages, tobacco and controlled substances at encampments or activities on property owned and/or operated by the BSA, or any activity involving participation of youth members.

Boundaries: Our camp boundaries and restricted areas are show on the trail map. Please remain on Seton Scout Reservation Property. If you're in doubt, speak to the camp master.

Chain Saws: An adult may use a chain saw if authorized by the camp master or council representative.

Right to Remove Camping Privileges: Ernest Thompson Seton Scout Reservation staff and the Greenwich Council reserves the right, at the discretion of the camp master or council representative, to ask guests of Seton Scout Reservation to leave the premises if they do not adhere to the rules and regulations herein and in the BSA Manual Guide to Safe Scouting.
