



# CAMP SETON

## MERIT BADGE PROGRAM INFORMATION

The Boy Scout Camp program is designed to expose campers to an array of fun and exciting hands-on Scouting activities. For registered Boy Scouts\* some of these activities are Merit Badge requirements that can be fulfilled while at camp. Our Merit Badge offerings and counselors are approved by the Greenwich Council, BSA Advancement Committee.

### Please note the following important information:

- Scouts are required to bring an open Blue Card to camp signed by their Scoutmaster. Camp counselors will not sign off on Merit Badge requirements without a signed blue card. Electronic approvals are accepted via email to [heather.brown@scouting.org](mailto:heather.brown@scouting.org)
- Merit Badge offerings may change weekly. Check website for Merit Badge updates at [www.campseton.org](http://www.campseton.org)
- Scouts are responsible for their Merit Badge materials while at camp (ie. pamphlets, blue cards, presentation materials, etc.)
- Camp Seton does not keep Merit Badge records. Individual requirements are signed off at each program area as they are completed. Partial and/or completed blue cards are sent home at the end of each week. Please take a photo of your blue card.
- Scouts may be responsible for the purchase of some supplies in order to fulfill a requirement (ie. basketry kit, food for cooking, etc). Merit Badge items are available at the Camp Trading Post.
- First year Scouts are encouraged to contact their Scoutmaster before attending camp to discuss advancement opportunities at Camp Seton.
- Counselors will only sign off on requirements that Scouts have actually and personally completed in accordance with BSA's ["Guide to Advancement"](#).
